- 1. **Welcome**: Our Iftaa course is designed to equip students with the knowledge and skills required to issue informed verdicts rooted in Islamic tradition.
- 2. **Duration**: This is a 1-year Iftaa course.
- 3. **Benefits of Iftaa:** Participate in real life case studies, issuing fatwa under the supervision of experienced and knowledgeable Muftis, developing the confidence and competence to be a responsible scholar in the community, working in collaboration with other institutes, organisations and personalities to enrich the experience and upskill our pupils.

4. Success Criteria for eligibility for an Iftaa Certificate: successful completion of 175 fatawa, three seminar, three assignments, two sets of examinations, along with excellent attendance and punctuality.

Study

1. Daily Study Hours: Students must dedicate about 6 hours daily to study and research. The following is simply an example of your daily schedule: Tahajjud, Fajr, Qur'an, Manzil and Dhikr, Class hours (8:00 - 12:15), independent study and research (2:00 - 4:00, 5:00 - 7: 00 and 8:00 - 10:00). There should be a set timetable for weekends too.

Allocate a set time for each: writing fatawa, preparing any presentation or research, revision of taught books, and most importantly a set amount of time daily for general mutala`a.

If not the entire books or some sections of a book then try to at least cover the contents of as many as books possible, e.g., at least the contents of a book every other day. This will, in return, help you locate an answer or a discussion related to a query in the future.

- 2. Course Material: Pupils should thoroughly review and understand the syllabus and recommended texts.
- 3. **Syllabus**: This includes specific chapters from the following books: Fiqh I-Buyu`, Rasml -Mufti, Usul I-Ifta, Introduction the Hanafi madh`hab, Mu`in I-Fara`idh, Nashr I-Urf and Radd I-Muhtar. All pupils will cover one text on `ibadat` front to back from a moderately-sized fiqh book e.g., Maraqi I-Falah.

Become familiar with Radd I-Muhtar (also known as Shami or Hashiyah Ibn Abideen). This is a heavily relied upon text and parts of which are taught for the year (such as Chapter of Taharah and Buyu`). Read its introduction. Radd I-Muhtar should be studied in conjunction with La`ali I-Mahar (for the citations in Radd I-Muhtar) and Fat`h I-Ghaffar (which is an index for the words and discussions in Radd I-Muhtar). Radd I-Muhtar is footnotes (Hashiyah) on a commentary (I-Durr I-Mukhtar) of a text (Tanwir I-Absar). Hence, the author adopts a unique style especially when quoting and referencing and explaining as deemed appropriate.

4. **Essential Reading**: Pupils will be required to conduct a reading of the following books: Kitab I-Masa`il / Fatawa Mahmudiyyah; selected *Rasa*`il from, for example, Ahsan I-Fatawa, Fatawa Dar I-Ulum Zakariyya, Fatawa Rahimiyyah, Imdad I-Fatawa and Jawahir I-Fiqh; Qamus I-Fiqh and Tuhfat I-Ulama.

Research / Assignments

1. **Research Ethics**: Students must adhere to strict ethical guidelines when conducting research, including proper citation.

Don't rely on books alone; also see other books and manuscripts to see if any errors in quotation.

Similarly, search for the original quote in a primary source when finding a quote in a secondary source.

Understand the whole discussion and chapter well before quoting a text and giving the fatwa.

- 2. **Research Proposals**: Submit a research proposal for approval before beginning your research presentation.
- 3. Use of Resources: Utilise the library and other academic resources efficiently and responsibly.

The essential books are available in the Darl -iftaa. Additional resources can be accessible in the main library. You may use pdfs if needed. However, you may want to purchase some books. This will allow you to scribe necessary notes within the books.

Remember that it is disallowed for you to make any notes in 'waqf' books or hoard them.

Return the 'waqf' book to the location taken from.

Do not take these books out of the Dar I-Iftaa. They should remain within the walls of Dar I-Iftaa.

4. **Research**: Each pupil is required to complete 3 assignments [of at least 1000 words each] per year. There will also be a viva wherein the pupil will defend his findings and showcase his knowledge around to the subject-area of the research. A grading will be provided. The following teachers are responsible for the following assignments:

1. **Presentation**: Each pupil is required to complete three 20-minute presentations per year [after the end of each term] on a particular book, journal or article (risalah). Active participation by all pupils in a dialogue format is necessary. A grading will be provided.

Books & Iftaa Class

- 1. **Library Usage**: Abide by the library rules, including proper handling of books returning the book to its place after use. Make sure no electronic devices leave the Iftaa class. Do not let or invite any pupils out of Iftaa class to enter the class without official authorisation.
- 2. **Personal Collection**: Maintain a personal collection of essential books for quick reference.
- 3. Book Reviews & Folder: Write reviews or summaries of key texts as part of your learning process.

If upon reading, you come across anything `exciting`, `new`, `contradictory`, `confusing`, `interesting` point/anecdote, then note it at the front or the back of the book with the page number.

Keep a separate account and folder of your written fatawa and researches – this folder should always be updated. This will be checked by any teacher or the office at any given time.

Do not let or invite any pupils out of Iftaa class to enter the class without official authorisation.

Attendance

- 1. Mandatory Classes: Attend all classes, seminars, trainings and practicals. All pupils must have an attendance of 95% at least
- 2. **Register**: Daily register will take place track attendance.
- 3. **Absences**: Report any absences in advance and make arrangements to catch up on missed material.

Punctuality

- 1. Timeliness: Arrive on time for all classes, presentations, and trainings.
- 2. **Deadlines**: Submit any work, including research papers and fatawa, by the established deadlines.
- 3. **Consistency**: Demonstrate consistent punctuality as a reflection of commitment and discipline.

Extra-curricular workshops, trainings and experiences

- 1. **Frequency**: There will be about two external speakers / trainings / experiences offered per term.
- 2. **Commitment**: Pupils must research the topic beforehand, participate actively in the training and write a review and summary after each workshop/training.

Spirituality

- 1. **Daily Salah**: Perform all five daily salah punctually, in congregation. Each pupil should be in the Masjid upon the call of the Adhan.
- 2. **Qur`an Recitation**: Dedicate time daily for Quran recitation and memorization. Each pupil must have a diary to record daily Qur`an recitation, daily dhikr, daily manzil, daily tahajjud, and the number of pages of mutala`a covered daily.
- 3. **Religious Link**: Each pupil must attend a weekend jama`at at least once each term. Each pupil should have connection to a spiritual mentor.
- 4 **Ethical Conduct**: Uphold high ethical and moral standards in all interactions and conduct. Similarly, the outward appearance, including clothing, beard and hair, must be in line with the expectations from an alim.

Assessments

- 1. **Regular Testing**: There will be two assessments annually. It is mandatory to sit all exams and successfully pass with an **overall minimum of 80%.**
- 2. Feedback: Actively seek and incorporate feedback from teachers and peers.
- 3. **Self-Evaluation**: Conduct self-evaluations to identify strengths and areas for improvement.
- 4. **Content**: The assessments will be based on taught books along with assigned independent reading material.
- 5. **Grading**: The mark will be determined as a percentage from all exam papers (questions based on exam and independent reading), termly seminars, assignment and completed fatawa.

Fatwa Writing

- 1. **Research-Based**: Base all fatwas on thorough research and evidence from reliable books of Hanafi figh.
- 2. **Guidance**: Seek guidance from senior scholars when issuing fatawa.
- 3. **Citation**: There should be through recitation, including book name, volume and page numbers and publishers. Most of the fatwas must have references from, at least, **three** classical Arabic books and **two** Urdu Fatawa.
- 4. **Clarity and Precision**: Ensure fatawa are clear, precise, and based on strong evidence, with correct spelling, punctuation, grammar and organised paragraphs.
- 5. **Research Methodology**: In any given fatwa, use the following criteria zahir riwayah, then books written after chronologically, check the mutun and then their shuruhat, and then ending at Radd I-Muhtar, thereafter, check the Urdu fatawa (again chronologically), any contemporary researches written and then just as a supporting evidences and spiritual exercise from the shuruhat of hadith and tafseer books.
- 6. **Scribing a Fatwa**: Adhere to the following guidelines: Understand the question well, explore all different avenues, keep your answer simple yet comprehensive, be respectful and formal in your language, do not sound intimidating or rude, quote an ayah or hadith within the text of the fatwa if helpful and clear, follow the preferences/tarjih provided by the fuqaha, avoid solitary or controversial opinions, and take support from the fatawa of the akabir.
- 7. Documentation: Keep detailed records of all fatawa issued, including references and reasoning.
- 8. **Peer Review**: After completing a fatwa and its subsequent approval, submit fatwas for peer review before final issuance to ensure accuracy, quality and comprehensiveness. You should send this electronically. In this way, pupils will be able to read through many more researches and could possibly discuss it as a class and make necessary edits, while developing faqahah in them. There will be an on-line drive with a folder for each teacher. All pupils will download the drive and add their approved fatwa to the folder relevant to that teacher.
- 9. **Submission**: Each response should be submitted [fully along with references] within [maximum] 72 hours (3 days) of receiving the question.

10. Total no. of Fatawa:

- Each pupil will receive 5 questions per week with an average of 20 questions per month.
- Each pupil will be given about 25 questions each by every teacher
- Hence, each pupil is required to complete 150 fatawa in total for the teachers.
- An approximate of 50 fatawa should be completed per term
- Each pupil will also receive 25 external questions throughout the year
- 11. **Structured Format**: Follow a structured format for writing fatwas, including an introduction, main body [with possible evidence], conclusion and references. Use the template given below.
 - All answers must be written with the question attached, and not the answer alone.
 - All answers must have two parts: one is the actual answer in brief [for the questioner] and the other included within the references [mainly for students of knowledge]

• The detailed explanation within the references must cover all scenarios or situations [encapsulated within the Hanafi texts]
